

Section 1: Talk/presentation & screening: Alessandra Arno (Italy) | Duration: 2 hours



Alessandra Arnò, artistic director of Visualcontainer, Italy, will make a special presentation of her project **"MEDITERRANEA - Analysis of experimental gender audiovisual production in the Mediterranean area**", a research project supported by **Italian Council (11th edition, 2022)**, a program aimed at supporting Italian contemporary art in the world promoted by the **Directorate-General for Contemporary Creativity within the Italian Ministry of Culture**. The research aims to bring to light the latest and more interesting artistic research from MENA Countries (Middle-East and North Africa) in the frame of the decolonization of contemporary experimental video art scenarios and establish a network of connections and collaborations among artists, curators, and scholars, facilitating the exchange of ideas and experimental audiovisual content. The project is realized in collaboration with many European festivals and Video Art Miden collaborates as a cultural partner.

In the frame of the project, after the presentation, the following screenings will take place: **A. "Femininity"**, a collection curated by **Fereshteh Alamshah**, including eleven video art works by thirteen Iranian female artists: 1. **Hamideh Sobhanifard**, 2. **Elahe Abdollahzadeh**, 3. **Mina Eshtehardiha**, 4. **Morvarid Ghasemi & Gelareh Goudarzi**, 5. **Farzaneh Sanaei**, 6. **Sahar Gholampour**, 7. **Shahireh Foroughi**, 8. **Shiva Motalebi & Zahra Barahimi**, 9. **Marzieh alsadat Golestaneh**, 10. **Nasim Mahdavi**, 11. **Dorsa Basij**

As the curator writes: "It is very difficult to be a woman and live artistically here, and it is even more difficult to be a female artist. Most of the works in this collection were produced months before the Iranian women's revolution, and some of them cannot be shown in Iran. During the past months, despite the sharp increase in restrictions and filtering in cyberspace, more security and economic pressures, Iranian artists are still working with motivation and hope that their voices will be heard."



One could argue that an antidote to post-truth is clarity. In times where it is harder to tell what the actual story is or how to pigeonhole all the images that we get flooded with daily, we long for some clarity. wysiwyg proposes a counter strategy that embraces the fragmented and undefinable. By presenting recent works that embrace non-linearity and flirts with form-over-content, an unexpected view is offered that shows the sign of the times, be it scattered.

Artist's talk and audiovisual retrospective presentation by visual artist/director Nikos Giavropoulos. From his first work, awarded at the 1st Medi@terra art & technology festival in Fournos in 1999, to the recent work he created especially for the anniversary of the Greek revolution of 1821, which belongs to the permanent collection of the National Gallery (Athens), Nikos Giavropoulos uses familiar figures from mythology, Greek

history and world art history as a vehicle to express contemporary concerns, creating a special and recognizable personal artistic style with the medium of video.

Section 4: Happiness is a warm gun | Curated by Olga Papadima | Duration: 47min



The famous line from the Beatles song can be interpreted as a comment on the illusory and fluid nature of happiness. Guns are associated with violence and destruction, and the warmth of a gun could be perceived as a false sense of security and strength. Likewise, the happiness derived from harmful or immoral actions is an illusion that ultimately leads to negative consequences. But true happiness is an inner state of peace and contentment that is not dependent on external circumstances.
